



**Meeting:** November 11, 2017

**Attendance:** 14 members and 2 guests

**Treasurer's report:** \$5878 + \$586 cash for a total of \$6464. 21 members have paid their dues. We now have 5 new members

**Discussion:** Our president had a previous engagement, Vice President Jorge Nazario led this meeting.

The proposed budget, by-laws and guidelines were voted upon and approved by the membership.

**This month's guest artist is Hiram Macias from Miami.** He gave an excellent presentation and demonstration on Nee

Hiram stated that it takes approximately 5-6 years to develop a nice silhouette. Nees have virtually no pests, and prefer full sun. Most mature nees are obtained from Puerto Rico, and propagation is from seeds, cuttings and air layers.

He recommends not letting the wire cut in and feed monthly with a balanced fertilizer and micronutrients. Nees tend to grow faster with an increase in humidity. The leaf color varies with the area in Puerto Rico that they were collected.

Hiram recommends repotting in the spring when the temperature is above 70 degrees, using a soilless mix and SuperThrive. He says to use cut paste on larger wounds, as they heal slowly. Topiary trimming in the growing stage is acceptable to increase branching.

He uses Biogold fertilizer for mame and shohin, Miracle Gro and Dyna Gro for others. Hiram states that he has had some problems with the new formulation of Osmocote.
